The 2021 NZSAP conference is trying something new and exciting. We have combined with the Grasslands conference, which is the <u>New Zealand Grasslands Association</u> (NZGA) and the <u>Agronomy Society of New Zealand</u>. This is a chance to try something different, broaden all our horizons and meet new people.

The Conference will be held in Invercargill from Tuesday 9th to Thursday 11th November. The venue is the <u>Ascot Park Hotel</u>, and there will be a social evening at <u>Bill Richardson Transport World</u>. Having recently attended a conference at Transport World, I can promise there is something for everyone at this amazing venue and the food is excellent. The NZGA local organising team has done a fantastic job pulling together a conference programme for the second time, as NZGA 2020 was postponed to this year due to Covid-19 challenges.

So far as the science goes with three societies at the one conference there is a jam-packed programme planned. There will be just over 100 papers, and we plan to bring common themes together for large, joined sessions to show overlap and synergies of our science, before moving apart for specialist concurrent sessions. Sessions will be fast-paced with many papers being 5 minutes to fit our full programme – presenters get ready to keep it short and sharp! Our traditional key sessions, Young Members and Living Legend will still be on the programme. There will also be two afternoons of field trips which will include but not be limited to Southern Dairy Hub, and a working flax mill.

Those of you planning ahead should look to get to Invercargill on Monday, as the conference will start first thing Tuesday and to allow people to get home, we are planning to finish early afternoon on Thursday.

Our 2011 Conference was held in Invercargill and had an excellent turnout, so we hope for more of the same this November. Book the dates in now, and I will make full details available as soon as they are confirmed. See you in Southland, and as a child of the South I am very happy to offer a few tips for those of you wanting to stay a little longer than the conference.
